Gosnell: The Trial of America's Biggest Serial Killer

On October 12th, the movie *Gosnell: The Trial of America's Biggest Serial Killer* was released. This movie tells the story of the investigation and trial of Dr. Kermit Gosnell, a Philadelphia abortion doctor.

Kathy Schiffer a Catholic blogger and writer for *The Catholic Register*, reviewed the film and wrote, "Gosnell is a compelling detective story, a psychological study of a twisted individual, a drama in which truth wins out against political pressure. It resists the temptation to titillate – not showing, for example, the actual bodies of babies stored in Gosnell's freezer; and for its restraint, it earned a PG-13 rating, making it suitable for teens as well as adults. The script, the cast, the filming are all-excellent. Dean Cain, best known to his fans as Superman, is a handsome investigator who refuses to look the other way, as others have done, when the squalid conditions at Gosnell's clinic are exposed. He insists that the case is about murder, not abortion; and in the end, he sees the arrogant Gosnell stripped of his medical license and hauled off to prison."

This movie presents a powerful compelling story—one that should not be missed.
