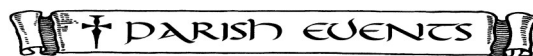

### Parish Update – From Fr. Michel

Brothers and Sisters,

It has been almost 10 years since I came to the United States. Over these years, I have witnessed the greatness of America through her values such as a democratic system, support for human rights and the obvious patriotism of her citizens. I see the same greatness in her virtues such as the openness to the neighbor, as well as a sense of kindness and decency. As Faithful Catholics and/or Citizens of this great Country, we understand that "With great power comes great responsibility." And of course, exercising your civil duty to vote is one of those great human powers and responsibilities in a democratic system.

As you all know, every four years brings us the election of our nation's highest office, President of the United States. In two days, this Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, millions of Citizens will enter polling stations across the State and vote for those who will hold political office in our State and in Washington, D.C. for the next two years or longer. Our Church understands that we need some guidance in making decisions regarding voting. **The guidelines are meant to help us form consciences that are informed, correct and free.** It is my hope that the Bishop's letter and the *Simply Catholic* Voter Guide inserted in this weekend parish bulletin, will be helpful (**if you haven't voted yet**) when you cast your vote out of LOVE for Church and Country.

**Our Bishop does not expect me to tell you which candidate to vote for. Let's be mindful of a simple fact that we are first Catholics.** We become everything else after that: Democrat, Independent, Republican, Conservative or Liberal. **More importantly, St. Mary's is a blessed CATHOLIC Parish because of ALL of you; Not ONLY Some. So, please DO YOUR HOMEWORK AND VOTE CONSCIOUSLY.** However, as "Ambassadors for Christ" (2 Cor. 5:20), we are supposed to bring courageously the values of a life lived in faith into the public square as the Saints did. Those Saints are our Church's models of human excellence who have given witness by their faith, courage, love, humility, and other virtues.

Let me finish by informing you the Eucharistic Adoration will be exposed on Election Day after the daily Mass (8:30am) thru 8:00pm. I invite you to consider spending some time in prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament this day for our Country and its new leaders.
