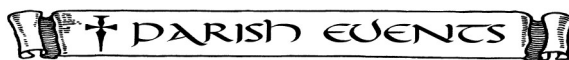

## Buildings and Grounds Update

**New Doors for Parish Hall and Church.** Tentatively, our new doors are scheduled to be installed during the week of November 18<sup>th</sup>. All eight doors in the parish hall and the two side doors in the church will be replaced.

**Tearing down the Old Rectory.** We have requested permission from the Architectural Review Board to tear down the old rectory. As soon as we get that permission we will proceed toward that end. We will offer parishioners the opportunity to take items that they might want from the building. After that, we will allow Habitat for Humanity to take what they can use, before tearing it down.

**Removal of sycamore and pecan trees behind the parish hall.** The huge sycamore tree and three large pecan trees behind the parish hall need to be taken down. The roots of the sycamore tree have destroyed part of the asphalt road and more significantly the roots are will soon damage the foundation of the parish hall. Additionally, a good hurricane wind from the east could cause the trees to fall right on the parish hall. The trees are on a neighbor's property, so we will be coordinating with them to get permission to fell them. The city has given approval to take them down.

## Parish Mission: November 7th—10th

Msgr. Steven Rohlfs, S.T.D. will present a parish mission for us from November 7<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>. Msgr. Rohlfs is a Spiritual Director for The St. Paul Seminary School of Divinity with a deep background of experience in serving as a parish priest. He is widely known as a speaker for parishes and priests and has conducted a mission for all of the priests of the Diocese of Charleston. Please mark you calendar and plan to attend.
