Buildings and Grounds Update

New Doors for Parish Hall and Church

Hamer Doors and Partitions of Florence has completed final measurements for installing ten new doors in the parish hall and church. Doors will meet requirements of the Architect Review Board and will be a high quality aluminum and fiberglass material. Front doors on the parish hall will have glass windows for safety and security reasons. Doors have been ordered from the factory and depending on the backlog, it could take about four-six weeks for them to be delivered. Installation will occur as soon as we receive shipment.

Movement of the Old Rectory

Dr. Clark, Pastor of Bethel AME Church has indicated that they cannot take the old rectory. Since no one has come forward to accept the rectory and move it, we will request permission from the Architectural Review Board to tear it down.

Capital Reserve Study

We are in the process of hiring a firm to conduct a capital reserve study for our parish. This study looks at all of our physical assets and buildings and projects what the future maintenance costs and replacement costs will be. This will greatly assist our Finance Council in developing long-term budgets for our parish.

Architect-Engineering Firm

Four members from our Buildings and Grounds Task Force are preparing to conduct interviews to select an architect-engineering firm. Once selected, this firm will study our entire campus and develop options to correct drainage issues; improve landscaping; repair the courtyard and entrance; and renovate and upgrade the interior of our church.

"This biographical drama tells the true story of Pedro Poveda (1874 - 1936), a tenacious and innovative priest who opened new paths in education and pioneered the rights of women in the early twentieth century. A victim of intolerance, he was murdered at the outbreak of the Spanish Civil War. In 1974, he was awarded the title of "Educator and Humanist" by UNESCO and was canonized a saint by Pope John Paul II in 2003.
