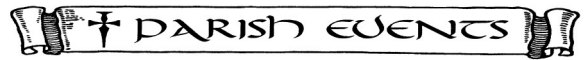

Adult Faith Formation: Apologetics Class continues through November 3rd
 Do you love your Catholic faith? Interested in learning more about it and how to defend it? Then join us for our sessions on Catholic Apologetics. Apologetics simply means giving a reasoned explanation for your faith. Some of what we will discuss are the Eucharist, the dogma of Our Lady, the Sacraments, and Purgatory. Hopefully these sessions will help us all to be able to more fully understand, explain and defend what we believe and why we believe to a world so much in need of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The dates for this class are October 20th, 27th and November 3rd in the Parish hall after the 10am Mass, beginning at 11:35 am. Deacon Mike Brescia will be presenting these classes. Anointing of the Sick
 "The celebration of this sacrament consists especially in the laying on of hands by the priests of the Church, the offering of the prayer of faith, and the anointing of the sick with oil made holy by God's blessing. The rite signifies the grace of the sacrament and confers it."
 "This sacrament gives the grace of the holy Spirit to those who are sick: by this grace the whole person is helped and saved, sustained by trust in God, and strengthened against the temptation of the Evil One and against anxiety over death. Thus the sick person is able not only to bear suffering bravely, but also to fight against it. A return to physical health may follow the reception of this sacrament if it will be beneficial to the sick person's salvation. If necessary, the sacrament also provides the sick person with the forgiveness of sins and the completion of Christian penance." P. 20. *Pastoral Care of the Sick: Rites of Anointing and Viaticum.*
 In general, the Sacrament of the Sick may be given to those facing a serious major operation, a serious illness or in the case of advanced age. It is advisable to receive this sacrament as soon as it is needed that you might receive the grace that God gives in the sacrament. If you feel you need to receive this sacrament, please contact Father before Mass or make an appointment through the church office.
